Fred Deneke was elected to the External Review Panel in 2006. He currently serves as the Forestry Programs Coordinator with the National Association of Conservation Districts, and consults with the “25 x ’25” Renewable Energy Initiative. Prior to his retirement from the USDA Forest Service in 2005, he was the Assistant Director of Cooperative Forestry in Washington, DC, a position he had held since 1990.
